

FAQS – BAVERSTOCK RD

1. What are you doing?

Urbanising Baverstock Rd (from Jack Rise to the Baverstock Rd and Brymer Rd intersection) — taking it from looking like a country road to one with kerb and channel and footpaths.

Creating a safer environment for people on bikes and pedestrians with new shared paths.

Building an interim pedestrian and biking connection from Baverstock Rd and Brymer Rd intersection to the entrance of Zoo/Waiwhakareke

2. When are you doing it?

Work is set to start early July (2020) and will take approximately six months.

3. Why are you doing it?

Following public feedback, the Council set aside up to \$2.9M in its 2018-2028 10 Year Plan to upgrade Baverstock Rd, improving safety and connectivity in the area.

4. Why are we only upgrading part of Baverstock Rd?

This is the last piece of the Road that has yet to be urbanised.

5. Will there be any road closures?

No. There are no scheduled road closures for this project.

6. How long will this project take?

Approximately six months.

7. Will there be any disruption to traffic?

There will be no road closures, but traffic management will be in place at times. Pedestrian access will always be maintained

8. Will there be any disruption to residents?

Access to properties will be mainly maintained (if we need to access individual properties we will contact those residents prior to gaining access) and the construction team will aim to keep disruptions to a minimum.

9. Are you upgrading the Baverstock Rd/Brymer Rd intersection?

Not currently, the intersection provides an acceptable level of service currently.

10. Are you upgrading the Brymer Rd/Bagust Rd intersection?

Not at this time, however it is budgeted for year six and seven of the 2018-28 10-Year Plan.
