NOTICE OF FURTHER SUBMISSION: VARIATION 1: RUAKURA VARIATION TO THE PROPOSED DISTRICT PLAN

Name of Submitter: Waikato Tree Trust

Introduction

The Waikato Tree Trust appreciates the opportunity to make a further submission on the Hamilton City Council's 'Variation 1: Ruakura Variation to the Proposed District Plan.

The Waikato Tree Trust (WTT) was formed in June 2001 by members of the community in response to an identified need for the protection of the many old and historic trees in the Waikato Region.

Our aims include providing community tree advocacy, increasing the number of protected trees in the region and providing tree care information for land owners developers and local authorities.

The purposes of the Trust include;

- The planting, establishment, protection, and development of trees and groups of trees within the Waikato.
- To encourage foster and develop public and private interest in the planting, development and protection of trees so as to raise the awareness of the role of trees in the environment.
- To promote arboriculture and actively involve the Waikato professional tree care community in trust activities.
- To encourage the restoration, enhancement and conservation of degraded or destroyed New Zealand indigenous habitats and plant communities including wetlands and lowland forests.
- To encourage local authorities in the Waikato region and elsewhere in New Zealand to undertake active tree planting programmes and to set aside areas for further tree planting development.
- To co-operate with other persons and organisations sharing aims and objectives similar to the objectives of this trust

General Comments;

Hamilton can be regarded as the "City of Trees". Trees listed under the Proposed District Plan confirm the will of the public to retain and protect significant trees in our city landscape. The Ruakura avenue of London Plane trees are such significant trees as with others throughout the Ruakura proposed variation site. The avenue had been listed as notable by the New Zealand Notable Tree Trust and are registered therefore meeting the criteria for retention within the site and further heritage landscape investigation.

2. Seek to allow the inclusion of a number of historic places, sites, plantings and area into Appendix 8 and 9 of Proposed District Plan.
3. Seek to allow a comprehensive heritage assessment of the historic site and include Ruakura Heritage Area, specifically in the Knowledge Zone
