Council Key Strategic Plans

Access Hamilton

The Access Hamilton Strategy aims to meet the changing travel demands of the city. The strategy outlines the need for an affordable, safe, responsive and sustainable transport system that contributes to Hamilton's strategic vision and achieves community outcomes in a way that is consistent with national and regional objectives.

Biking Plan

Hamilton's Biking Plan will contribute to a more attractive and liveable city for families. The plan aims to make biking safe, convenient and visible; encouraging more people to bike more often in Hamilton.

Central City Safety Strategy

Safety in the central city is consistently identified as a high priority for the people of Hamilton. The first Central City Safety Plan was adopted by the Council in September 2014. It was developed alongside the Central City Transformation Plan and together, both plans aimed to understand and improve safety. A key part of this was improving how people feel about visiting central Hamilton and providing an attractive, vibrant city centre.

Central City Transformation Plan

The Central City Transformation Plan (CCTP) aims to transform Hamilton's central city into a prosperous commercial centre, with a vibrant metropolitan lifestyle. The plan is an action-focused practical approach with a mixture of short and long-term projects designed to revitalise the central city and encourage more people to visit, live and work there.

Disability Action Plan

The Disability Youth Action Plan was developed in collaboration with the disability sector. The plan outlines specific actions that Council units will undertake to ensure people with disabilities have equity and access so they can participate in and contribute to community and civic life. The plan gives effect to Council's Disability Policy.

Economic Development Agenda

The Economic Development Agenda sets out Council's vision to work with the city's business community and others to energise economic growth and strengthen Hamilton's contribution to the New Zealand economy.

Frankton Neighbourhood Plan

The Frankton Neighbourhood Plan outlines actions to support the development of one of Hamilton's oldest suburbs over the next 10-20 years. The plan sets out a number of early, short and longer term projects for the area that support the outcomes of:

- Retaining and growing Frankton's unique economy
- More people living in Frankton
- Preserving, enhancing and sharing Frankton's history
- Attracting visitors to Frankton's history and quirky character
- Strengthening Frankton's connections with Hamilton as a city

Hamilton Arts Agenda and Public Art Plan

The Hamilton Arts Agenda and Public Art Plan is the Council's strategic action plan for the delivery of arts-related initiatives and projects to grow the creative economy and enable Hamiltonians to celebrate and enjoy the arts. It will help guide the allocation of the Council's funding and resources and it will provide direction for the arts sector.

Hamilton East Neighbourhood Plan

The Hamilton East Neighbourhood Plan aims to make Hamilton East a popular and attractive character suburb that embraces its history. The Plan is a key project to highlight our distinctive suburban villages and guide future developments.

Hamilton Libraries Strategic Plan

The Hamilton Libraries Strategic Plan provides direction for the enhancement of Council's libraries services. The plan aims to provide a modern library service which caters for influences from new technology and the changing needs of users.

Council Key Strategic Plans

Hamilton Urban Growth Strategy

The Hamilton Urban Growth Strategy is Council's spatial vision for the city. The strategy is the strategic approach that was agreed to by Council following a city-wide consultation process undertaken in November and December 2008.

Heritage Plan

The Heritage Plan sets out Council's approach to celebrating Hamilton's heritage in all its forms. The plan outlines actions for the Council to identify, manage, protect, conserve and appreciate Hamilton's historic heritage

Open Spaces Plan

The Open Space Plan sets out a 50-year strategic direction for Hamilton's parks and open spaces. The plan presents a series of goals, priorities and an action plan that responds to the needs, challenges and opportunities facing Hamilton's open space. This plan was developed in consultation with the community.

Playgrounds of the Future Plan

The Playgrounds of the Future Plan outlines Council's direction and priorities relating to the delivery of new playgrounds. The Plan guides the maintenance, upgrading and/or the development of new playgrounds. The plan aims to make playgrounds an experience with equipment that stimulates both physical and mental activity.

Pooches and Parks Plan

The Pooches and Parks plan outlines where new dog exercise areas will be established in the city including two fenced dog exercise areas. It also outlines how we intend to make the central city more dog friendly and provides an overview of actions to launch an etiquette campaign aimed at both people who own pooches and those who don't.

River Plan

The Hamilton City River Plan is a comprehensive strategy to transform the way we use and view the 16km of Waikato River running through the city. The Plan is a 30-year vision for the river and will guide how we plan and use the river into the future.

Speed Management Plan

Hamilton has a Vision Zero goal for road safety. We don't believe any loss of life on our city's roads is acceptable and we need to ensure transport routes are as safe as they can be. Road safety risk can be reduced by investing in infrastructure improvements to make a road safer at current speeds, or by managing speeds down through a combination of road design, risk targeted enforcement and education on safe behaviour, all reinforced by speed limits appropriate for the roads. Hamilton City Council's Speed Management Plan outlines the principals which will guide the application of speed management and the prioritisation process that will guide us in our approach to implementing speed management.

Waikato Museum Strategic Plan

The Museum Strategic Plan outlines how the Waikato Museum will respond to changing shifts and trends facing museums. The plan provides actions to develop a distinctly Waikato identity and be relevant to our communities.

Local Government Plans and Strategies

Local Government Act

- 10-Year Plan (incorporating the financial strategy)

The 10-Year Plan sets out our priorities, plans and budget for Hamilton over the next decade, with a specific focus on the next three years.

- Annual Plan

The Annual Plan sets out the Council's annual budget. It is produced in the two years between each 10-Year Plan.

- Long Term Infrastructure Strategy

This strategy is Council's 30-Year Infrastructure Strategy for the city and it aligns infrastructure delivery with the Hamilton Plan.

Waste Minimisation Act

- Waste Management and Minimisation Plan 2018-2024

This Plan sets the direction for Council in regard to waste management and minimisation.

Resource Management Act

- District Plan

This District Plan governs the way Hamilton looks and feels and sets the rules for future city development.

Regional Strategic Plans

Hamilton Age Friendly Plan

A number of community agencies, organisations and businesses have collaborated to develop the Hamilton Age Friendly Plan 2018-21. More than 20 groups worked together to create the plan, which includes 48 actions for completion over the four years from 2018. Supported by Hamilton City Council, the plan aims to build on Hamilton's strengths and make it an even better city for older people to live in.

Three Waters Strategy

(Waikato, Waipa and HCC, Commenced September 2012). A strategy to set a long term vision for Three Waters in the sub-region (Waipa, Waikato, and Hamilton City).

Waikato Regional Economic Development Strategy – Waikato Means Business

Waikato Means Business is a 20-year Waikato economic development strategy.

Waikato Plan

Waikato's regional and local councils are taking a 'One Waikato' view for the future of our region.

Future Proof Strategy

The growth strategy for Hamilton, Waipa and Waikato sub-region.

Waikato Regional Sports Facility Plan

The plan provides a high level strategic framework for regional sports facilities planning.
